Introduction

The Centre for Contemporary Indian Studies (CCIS) is a multidisciplinary research centre which promotes activities connected with developing knowledge in Sri Lanka on contemporary studies in India and strengthening Indo-Lanka relationship through an institutionalized network between the two countries. It was established in 2012 under a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed between the High Commission of India in Sri Lanka and the University of Colombo. The Centre functions under the Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) for academic and administrative matters and it is also linked with other faculties through its Advisory Board and Management Board. India and Sri Lanka are connected through social, religious, linguistic, cultural, economic and strategic ties that date back several centuries. However, less importance has been placed on the study of contemporary developments and changes in India. By realizing that such research and study undertaken at Sri Lanka's seat of higher learning will play an important role in guiding and strengthening the social and economic development of the country and existing bonds of friendship between India and Sri Lanka, the Centre for Contemporary Indian Studies serves to deepen the understanding of contemporary India in Sri Lanka.

Vision of the CCIS

To evolve and grow as an academic hub for promoting research and knowledge on contemporary India.

Objectives

The chief function of the Centre is to provide an intellectual forum for researchers, academic staff and postgraduates working in the field of contemporary Indian studies and offer a base for research for its members in collaboration with other institutions. It hopes to nurture a new generation of interdisciplinary scholars, and to provide a forum for public dialogue among the academic, business, and foreign policy communities. Therefore, the Centre aims to serve as a focus for lectures, seminars and other research events in the field, including collaborative research projects. The CCIS welcomes links with other scholars, nationally and internationally.

The former Sri Lankan Ambassador to Thailand and the Emeritus Prof. J. B. Disanayaka delivered the keynote address at the inaugural session of this Symposium. In the academic

session of the symposium Dr. Sandagomi Coperahewa was the moderator. Prof. K. N. O. Dharmadasa - Editor in Chief of Sinhala Encyclopedia, Dr. K. D. G. Wimalaratne - former Director of Dept. of National Archives, Prof. Asanga Tilakarathna - Pali and Buddhist Studies Unit of University of Colombo and Dr. Gitanjali Surendran - Associate Professor of Jindal Global University, Delhi presented their papers at this Symposium. Dr. Kumara Hirimburegama - Vice Chancellor of the University of Colombo, academics of the University and other invitees participated in the Symposium. The Centre intends to publish a volume on this symposium proceedings next year.

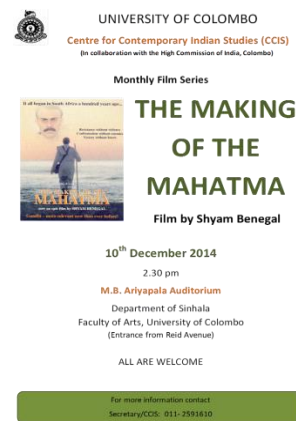

CCIS JOURNAL

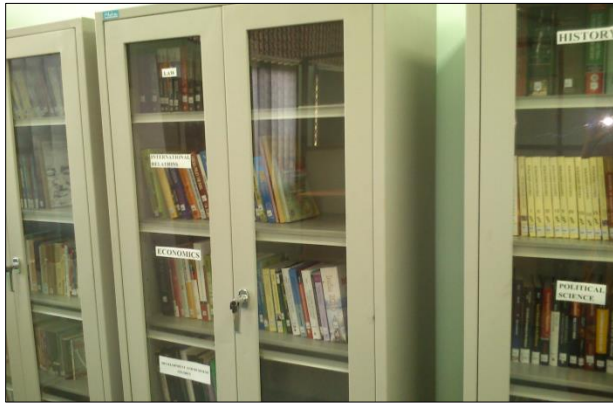

VOLUME ON *GITANJALI* CENTENARY (1913 - 2013)

The CCIS has taken the initiative to publish a volume titled *One Hundred Years of Gitanjali* to mark the century of Tagore's Nobel Prize-winning work *Gitanjali* (1913-2013). CCIS has invited

twelve scholars from both Sri Lanka and India to contribute to this volume. The volume is intended to be released in early 2015.

CCIS LIBRARY AND RESOURCE CENTER



The CCIS Library is now a fully functioning library with over 600 books, both in English and Sinhala in the field of Contemporary India. It has latest additions to the fields of International Relations, History, Sociology, Political Science and Fiction related to India. The library is being utilized by the undergraduates of the university and it also provides internet and photocopy facilities to them. During the year library received a set of books on Rabindranath Tagore from the Vishva Bharati Publications, Kolkata. Now the library maintains a special collection on Tagore works.
